uring the thirty-eighth week since the coup, fighting between the Burma Army (BA) and Kachin Independence Army (KIA) occurred in Inndaw, Danai, Momauk, Kachin State, and in Muse and Kutkai, Shan State. In other parts of the country, the BA clashed with MNDAA, KNLA, KNDF, and KA. Additionally, clashes between the BA and the People's Defence Forces (PDF) were reported in Sagaing Region, including in Taze Township. This week, violence against regime informants and collaborators, and around government offices and junta's assets was reported in Naypyitaw, Buthidaung, Thanbyuzayat, Momauk Loikaw, Taze, Maubin, Minhla, Wantwin, Thein Zayat, Tigyaing, Katha, Nyaung-U, Buthalin, Paung, Pyapon, Hlaingtaryar, Mandalay, Beelin, Taungoo, Pathein Gyi, Yesagyo, and Loikaw. Between October 19 and 22, people across Burma participated in the "Thadingyut Revolution" using candle lights, online campaigns, and prayer services.

Humanitarian Crisis and Human Rights Violations

- On October 16 in Sagaing Township, Sagaing Region, security forces raided a charity worker Ko Shine Ko's house to arrest him but he was not home. They took money (approximately \$800), laptop, motorbike, and other valuables instead.
- On October 16 in Khin-U Township, Sagaing Region, the BA soldiers arrested a civilian who was sleeping at his home. He was <u>accused of</u> <u>working with the PDF and was beaten to death on the same day of</u> his arrest.
- On October 16 in Matupi Township, Chin State, <u>a six-year old girl</u>
 <u>was killed by shrapnel</u> when the BA fired artillery near her family farm
 in Valangpi Village. According to locals, no clashes were taking place
 at the time of the incident.
- On October 17 in Sartaung, Sagaing Region, the BA used an ambulance and several motorcycles to raid the Sartaung PDF training camp, killing two members and arresting one.
- On October 17 in Pyapon Township, Ayeyarwaddy Region, following news of the military-owned Mytel telecommunication tower being destroyed, security forces arrested 30 local young people.
- On October 18 in Mandalay, <u>security forces attacked an anti-coup</u> protest, injuring 20 civilians and arresting another 10.
- On October 18 in Taungoo Township, Bago Region, security forces arrested two youth activists, Richard Soe and Wai Phyo Thu. Then on October 21, Wai Phyo Thu passed away from the injuries he sustained during the arrest.
- On October 20 in Yebyu Township, Thanintharyi Region, <u>security</u> forces shot and killed a 60-year old civilian, Kyi Thein, when they

Other Updates

- In Kengtung Township, Shan State, three young people, Julie, Yun Lae Nandar, and Nan Khan Phue Myat, were sentenced to three years in prison.
 They were arrested back on February 15 for participating in anti-coup protests.
- Ko Lin Paing Soe, a
 Buddhist Gurkha student
 who led anti-regime protests
 in Naypyitaw and Mandalay,
 was arrested on September
 30, and died his first night
 in custody. Security forces
 reportedly used racial and
 religious slurs as they
 tortured him.
- On October 16, Duwa Bawmwang La Raw, the founder, President of the Kachin National Council, and vice-Chairman of the Kachin National Organization (KNO) passed

- could not find his son who has alleged connections with the PDF.
- On October 20 in Taungoo Township, Bago Region, <u>plain clothes</u>
 <u>officers arrested three college students who were playing video</u>
 <u>games</u> at a local tea shop. The arrest was likely prompted by news of local Mytel towers being destroyed.
- On October 21 in Nanmun-Inndawgyi, Kachin State, <u>a 13-year old</u>
 <u>boy was killed by a bomb explosion</u>. The bomb is thought to be a
 leftover from the fighting in the area in May.
- On October 21 in Pale Township, <u>security forces arrested two</u> teenagers and asked their families for money in exchange for their release.
- On October 22 in Khin-U Township, Sagaing Region, the <u>BA troops</u> opened fire in <u>Ba-Oh Village</u>, killing two locals and injuring one.
- In Chin State, <u>approximately 40,000 residents have fled their homes</u> due to rampant village torchings carried out by the BA troops.
- In Gangaw Township, Magwe Region, thousands of displaced civilians from Hnan Khar Village had to flee their temporary shelters due to severe flooding.

- away due to Covid-19 complications. His dream, and also the objective of the KNO, is to establish a liberated Kachin homeland.
- On October 18, the coup regime released over 5,600 people, most of whom were arrested for participating in anti-junta protests.
 In Meiktila Township, Mandalay Region, 11 of the 38 political prisoners released were arrested again as they walked out the prison.
